

Naloxone: Fundamentals for Pharmacists Dispensing to Caregivers and Patients at Risk for Opiate and Opioid Toxicity



On-Demand Program

This two-hour home study course will be conducted completely online.

Over the past several decades there has been an emerging and persistent epidemic of opiate and opioid overdoses and deaths. Naloxone prescription programs have been implemented in the US based on the premise that naloxone be provided to individuals who may be in the best position to respond rapidly to an opiate or opioid overdosed patient. In 2014, legislation was passed to allow pharmacists to furnish naloxone in accordance with a state-board approved protocol. This program is designed to provide the required training of pharmacists to participate in the protocol.

Target Audience: South Carolina Pharmacists

Requirements to receive CPE credit:

At the completion of this knowledge-based educational activity, pharmacists will be able to:

- Characterize the pharmacology and toxicology for opiates and opioids and their response to naloxone.
- List risk factors for opiate and opioid poisoning toxicity and deaths as a guide to recognize patient populations who may benefit from treatment with naloxone in the home or community setting.
- Recognize situations involving the therapeutic and illicit use of opiates and opioids that are at high risk for toxicity and potentially requiring the use of naloxone.
- Compare the advantages and disadvantages of naloxone products available for take-home use with their respective administration techniques, adverse effects, and end-points of therapy.
- Recite the stepwise approach to manage a patient manifesting toxicity from an opiate or opioid in the community setting.
